Open Records Decision No. 92

Re: Last known address of
persons pardoned.

Dear Mr. Whiteside:


Pursuant to section 7 of the Open Records Act, article 6252-17a, V. T. C. S., you have requested our decision as to whether the last known address of persons pardoned is excepted from disclosure under section 3(a)(1), which excepts "information deemed confidential by law, either Constitutional, statutory, or by judicial decision." Your question is whether any federal law excepts this information from disclosure.

We are aware of no federal law which would prevent disclosure of the requested information.


In Open Records Decision No. 33 (1974), we held that the name, address of record, and certain other information about persons convicted of possession of marijuana whose sentences have been commuted by the Governor should be disclosed. We believe that Decision is applicable here.

The requestor also sought other information which would be helpful in locating these individuals. No information of this type has been furnished to us and no exception which might apply to such information has been suggested. Accordingly, we do not reach that issue.
