RE: Request for Legal Opinion

To Whom It May Concern:

I am writing to request a legal opinion on the following question:

Article 6.301 of the Texas Family Code contains the general rule relating to the residency requirement for persons filing for divorce. Article 15.019 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code contains the rule governing venue in prison inmate litigation with the specific proviso: "This section does not apply to an action brought under the family code.". May the District Clerk, pursuant to court order, in counties where prison units operated by the Texas Department of Criminal Justice are located, decline to file petitions under the Family Code (divorce, etc.), where the residency requirement is based on time served in prison, ("suspect of bad faith" under <u>Cook v. Mayfield</u>, 886 S.W.2d 840) and by virtue of Article 15.019 of the Texas Civil Practice and Remedies Code?
