Dear General Cornyn:

This is to request an opinion pursuant to Section 402.042, Government Code, regarding whether a local branch of the Firefighter's and Police Officer's Civil Service Commission authorized under Chapter 143 of the Local Government Code can require local fire department job applicants to be United States citizens although no similar requirement exists under state law.

## **FACTS**

Three non-United States citizens recently applied for a fire fighter positions with the Laredo Fire Department. Upon review of the applications and subsequent interviews, the Laredo Civil Service Commission denied these applications based partially on their status as citizens of Mexico. The Laredo City Council and Manager contend that LCSC's consideration of applicant citizenship status is unlawful.

## **QUESTIONS**

Please provide an opinion regarding the following questions:

1. Does the Laredo Civil Service Commission's citizenship requirement disqualify non-United States applicants in violation of state law?

2. Does Section 143.023(d), Local Government Code, which conditions an applicant's post-employment certification on the pre-employment citizenship statute justify the initial citizenship requirement?
