Dear General Cornyn:

This is to request an opinion pursuant to Section 402.042, Government Code, regarding the provision of assistance to the Randolph Metrocom Chamber of Commerce regarding the procedure for separation from an existing college district.

## FACTS

The Randolph Metrocom Chamber of Commerce has appointed a committee to investigate higher education options in the Greater Randolph Area (Northeast Bexar County). One of the options being studied is the separation from the Alamo Community College District and the creation of a new community college district. The Chamber sought the assistance of the Texas Higher Education Coordinating Board. The HECB told the chamber that the Texas Administrative Code does not contain provisions governing the separation of an entity from an existing college district. The Chamber requests the assistance of the Attorney General's Office in determining the procedural requirements for separation from an existing college district.

## QUESTIONS

Please provide an opinion regarding the following questions:

What procedural steps are required for a geographic entity to separate from an 1. existing community college district?

- 2. May a portion of a county separate? In the most likely scenario, three school districts would form the newly proposed community college district. Is it possible for school districts to break away?
- 3. Assuming a break-away is possible, what portion of the existing community college district's debt will the residents of the new district have responsibility?
