Dear General Cornyn:

On behalf of Wharton County I have been requested to seek an Attorney General's Opinion on whether excess contributions under government code §26.008 to a Constitutional County Judge can be paid out as a <u>one-time</u> salary payment to court personnel under the meaning of §21.006 of the Government Code for "Court Related Purposes."

<u>Facts</u>

On October 3, 2000 the Comptroller of Public Accounts deposited \$962.42 into Wharton County's bank account in accordance with Government Code #26.008(a) for "excess contributions" received. The maximum supplement of \$10,000.00 per Constitutional County Court Judge has been reached for FYOO under §26.006 of the Government Code. The \$962.42 was designated to be deposited in the County's general funds to be used <u>only</u> for "court-related purposes" for the support of the judiciary as provided by §21.006 of the Government Code.

On November 17, 2000 the Constitutional County Judge directed that the Treasurer pay the \$962.42 to a court employee as a salary supplement.

Since statute does not define "court-related purposes", would that include a one-time salary supplement to court personnel or would that be prohibited as a "bonus?"

Since this will most likely impact other county's use of those funds, your prompt response will be appreciated. The Treasurer is holding the funds in suspense until a determination is received from your office.
