**OPINION COMMITTEE** 

The passage of House Bill 1051<sup>i</sup> during the 1999 legislative session created a new type of licensee regulated by the Texas Optometry Board: the "Optometric Glaucoma Specialist." Practitioners possessing this license have greatly expanded authority versus therapeutic optometrists and optometrists (the other two types of licensees regulated by the Board).

Some Optometric Glaucoma Specialists have indicted to the Board that they desire to use a professional designation consisting solely of their name plus the phrase "Optometric Glaucoma Specialist." This listing would be in the following form:

Dr. Jane Doe, Optometric Glaucoma Specialist

These doctors have asked the Board if they can legally use such a professional designation even though the designation is not listed in Tex. Occ. Code Ann. § 104.103(f) (Vernon 2000). Section 104.103 lists mandatory forms of professional identification to be used by practitioners of the healing arts, and the statute does not include the designation "Optometric Glaucoma Specialist." However, section 2 of House Bill 1051, in subsection (r) of the amendments to article 4552-1.03, specifically directs that these licensees "... shall be known as optometric glaucoma specialist[s]."

Because House Bill 1051 and § 104.103 appear to be in direct conflict, the Board authorized me on December 4, 2000, to seek an opinion of the Attorney General on whether an optometric glaucoma specialist may list their name in the form set out above as their sole means of professional designation.
