REQUEST FOR ATTORNEY'S GENERAL'S OPINION

ISSUE:

Whether a person who falls asleep while driving and goes of a road has committed the offense of failure to drive in a single lane?

ARGUMENT AND AUTHORITIES

The Texas Transportation Code section 545.060 states in pertinent part:

(a) An operator on a roadway divided into to two or more clearly marked lanes for traffic: (1) shall drive as nearly practical entirely within a single lane; and (2) may not move from the lane unless that movement can be made safely.

A violation of this statute requires a conscious act on the part of the driver to change lanes when such a change cannot safely be done. See dicta in Lopez v. Hernandez, 595 S. W. 2d 180 (Tex. Civ. App. 1980)

An individual who falls asleep at the wheel cannot being committing a conscious act when his vehicle drifts off the road and the driver cannot be violating this failure to drive in a single lane statute.

SUMMARY

A driver who falls asleep while driving and drifts off the road cannot be committing the offense of Failure to Drive in a Single Lane because such a violation requires a conscious act.
