# **Additional Information**

The Board of Barber Examiners currently does participate in the Texas Online Project for license renewals. However, because of the requirement that licensees must present a health certificate to the Board before a license can be issued or renewed, Barber Board licensees can only pay online. They cannot complete the license renewal process online. Applicants who pay online must still mail to the Board the required health certificate before a license can be issued.

The Board is required to collect \$6 from all barbers and \$3 from all manicurists who renew their licenses regardless of whether or not the licensee uses Texas Online to pay the renewal fee. All licensees, including those who use Texas Online to pay their fees online, must still mail to the Board their health certificate. Therefore, most licensees choose not to participate in Texas Online, even though they must pay either the \$6 fee or the\$3 fee anyway. Agency staff maintains a file of licensees who have paid renewal fees through Texas Online. A license is not renewed for those individuals until the health certificate is received in the mail and matched to the Texas Online payment record.

Approximately five percent (5%) of current Barber Board licensees who are eligible to use the Texas Online system choose to do so. Barber licensees are being required to pay fees to use a system that does not allow them to actually renew their licenses online because of the statutory requirement for the presentation of the health certificate.

Therefore, the Board is seeking guidance on how it can be required to both participate in the Texas Online project for the issuance or renewal of licenses for which a health certificate is required and at the same time comply with the statute that applicants present a health certificate to the Board before certain licenses can be issued or renewed.

Chapter 1601.264 of the Texas Occupations Code states:

"The board may not issue a certificate or license until an applicant presents a health certificate from a physician stating that the applicant does not have an infectious or contagious disease."

Texas State Board of Barber Examiners Request for Attorney General's Opinion April 28, 2004

Chapter 1601.402(d) of the TOC states:

"The Board may not renew a certificate or license until an applicant presents a health certificate from a physician stating that the applicant does not have an infectious or contagious disease."

Barber Board Rule 51.98 (Texas Administrative Code Title 22, Part 2, Chapter 51.98) currently states:

"As required by Senate Bill 187 and Senate Bill 645, 77<sup>th</sup> Legislature, Regular Session, each licensee, upon renewal, shall pay the following State-Mandated Fee for Occupation Licensing Transactions Using the Internet: \$6.00 for a barber; \$3.00 for a manicurist. This fee is in addition to the renewal fee."

Relevant bills concerning the Texas Online Project passed by the legislature and signed into law by the Governor include:

- (1) SB 187, 77<sup>th</sup> Leg., RS;
- (2) SB 645, 77th Leg, RS; and,
- (3) SB 1152, 78<sup>th</sup> Leg, RS. SB 187, Subchapter I, Sec. 2054.252 Texas Online Project creates Texas Online.

SB 645, 77<sup>th</sup> Leg, RS, Sec. 2054.252 states:

"Applicability. (a) The following licensing authorities shall participate in the system established under Section 2054.253" (252?):

(1) "State Board of Barber Examiners;"

SB 1152, 78<sup>th</sup> Leg, RS, Section 7 again requires the Board of Barber Examiners to participate in the Texas Online project.
