RE: The authority of the El Paso District Clerk or County Clerk to establish an online electronic database accessible to the public

## Dear Attorney General Abbott:

I respectfully request your opinion on the authority of the El Paso District Clerk or County Clerk to create an electronic database that may be accessible via the internet to allow the public to more easily access court documents.

Technology is allowing governmental bodies to store and process information and documents more quickly and efficiently than ever before. This in turn facilitates and improves access of information for the public. However, current state laws may not provide sufficient clarity regarding the use of technology by governmental bodies to store and provide information.

Under current state law, may the El Pasco District Clerk or County Clerk create an electronic database accessible online to display civil, family and criminal case docket information in its entirety and all document images pertaining to all cases filed regardless of case disposition or status?

If such a database can be created, should access to the electronic database be limited to certain parties? Furthermore, should personal identifiers on the documents to be displayed, such as Social Security numbers and/or bank accounts, be redacted? Lastly, could the El Pasco District Clerk or County Clerk assess a reasonable fee to the public in order to retrieve information?
