Dear Attorney General Greg Abbott:

The current ordinance regulating the location of Sexually Oriented Businesses for San Patricio County, Texas, states in pertinent part:

Section 4. Location of Sexually Oriented Businesses

- (A) The operation of sexually oriented businesses is prohibited on premises that are located within 1300 feet of:
  - (1) a residential property;
  - (2) a church;
  - (3) a public or private elementary school;
  - (4) a child care facility;
  - (5) a public park;
  - (6) another sexually oriented business which has been issued a permit under this Order.

Furthermore, the Ordinance defines **Residential property** as: a residential estate, one-family dwelling, townhouse dwelling, multiple dwelling, travel trailer park, mobile home park, mobile home subdivisions, or apartment house, the primary purpose of which serves as residential accommodations.

I respectfully request an Attorney General's Opinion on the following questions:

- 1) Would a regulation requiring that certain sexually oriented businesses be located a minimum of 2000 feet from designated places (as indicated above) exceed the legislative authority granted to counties?
- 2) What is the maximum distance from designated places (as indicated above) that a county can require that certain sexually oriented businesses be located without exceeding the legislative authority granted to counties?

Your assistance in this matter would be appreciated.
