Re: Opinion Request

Dear Attorney General Abbott:

On behalf of the Washington County Attorney Renee Ann Mueller, I am requesting an opinion as to whether the minium salary of the Washington County Court at Law Judge, under Government Code Sec. 25.0005(a) is to include in the calculation of the "district judge's total annual salary" supplements from other counties in our multi-county judicial district.

Currently, Washington County is part of a four county judicial district which in addition to Washington includes, Bastrop, Burleson, and Lee Counties. There are two district judges who ride circuit within the district. Burleson and Lee Counties each provide supplements to the district judges salaries. However, Washington County does not provide such a supplement.

Our interpretation of the Code is that in a multi-county judicial district, a district judges "total annual salary" includes only the supplements received by the district judge from the county in which the statutory county court judge whose salary in question serves. Being that Washington County does not supplement the district judges salaries, it is my opinion that the salary calculation of the Washington County Court at Law Judge should not include the supplements paid to the district judges by other counties in our district.

I want to waive 402.042(c) requirements.
